Latest QS World University Rankings see ETH Zurich - Swiss Federal Institute of Technology ranked 8th

London, 8th June 2021: ETH Zurich - Swiss Federal Institute of Technology has been named as the world's 8th best university, according to the latest edition of the world's leading university ranking. The eighteenth edition of the QS World University Rankings, released today by global higher education analysts QS Quacquarelli Symonds, names the world's 1300 best universities. Massachusetts Institute of Technology has been named the global number-one for a record-extending tenth consecutive year.

The rankings provide authoritative comparative analysis on the performance of the world's **top 1300 universities – 145 more than in 2021's edition** – which can be found in 97 locations. **6415 institutions** were nominated for evaluation, **3775** evaluated as eligible, and **1673** were analyzed. The results also account for the distribution and performance of **14.7 million academic papers** published between 2015 and 2019, and the **96 million citations** received by those papers.

- ETH Zurich Swiss Federal Institute of Technology now ranks 1 within Switzerland.
- Based on the the number of institutions ranked in the overall table, Switzerland is the 31st-most-represented location in the world.
- Based on the number of top-200 universities, Switzerland is the 8th -strongest global higher education location.
- In Academic Reputation, ETH Zurich Swiss Federal Institute of Technology achieves a score of 98.7 which corresponds to a rank of 18 for this dataset.
- In Employer Reputation, ETH Zurich Swiss Federal Institute of Technology achieves a score of 95.3 which corresponds to a rank of 30 for this dataset.
- In Citations per Faculty, ETH Zurich Swiss Federal Institute of Technology achieves a score of 99.8 which corresponds to a rank of 15 for this dataset.
- In Faculty/Student Ratio, ETH Zurich Swiss Federal Institute of Technology achieves a score of 80.4 which corresponds to a rank of 134 for this dataset.
- In International Faculty Ratio, ETH Zurich Swiss Federal Institute of Technology achieves a score of 100 which corresponds to a rank of 22 for this dataset.
- In International Student Ratio, ETH Zurich Swiss Federal Institute of Technology achieves a score of 98.2 which corresponds to a rank of 58 for this dataset.

Global Highlights

- Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) celebrates an unprecedented, unbroken decade as the world's best university.
- The top five also experiences its most significant reconfiguration for half a decade: Harvard University (5th) falls out of the top three its lowest-ever rank to be replaced by the University of Oxford (2nd, up from 5th) and the University of Cambridge (joint-3rd, shared with Stanford University).
- Caltech (6th) drops out of the top five for the first time since 2015.
- ETH Zurich remains continental Europe's best university for a fourteenth consecutive year.



- In a major milestone, Mainland China is home to two of the world's top twenty universities for the first time ever.
- Asia's two top universities are National University of Singapore (11th) and Nanyang Technological University (12th).
- Australia's four top universities rise, with Australian National University re-entering the top 30. Curtin University and Macquarie University have entered the top 200 for the first time in a decade.
- Malaysian and Russian progress slows after years of improvement, but both are home to one of the world's top 100 universities each.
- 48% of Japan's universities decline.
- Latin America's best university is Universidad de Buenos Aires (69th). Hampered by low research impact scores, more of the continent's universities fall than rise.
- Saudi Arabia's top university King Abdulaziz University, 109th reaches a record high.
